Benefice Letter

Dear All

There have been so many shocking and distressing images of the Ukrainian conflict in the press and on television, but among them there was one this spring which was both surprising and yet reassuring at the same time. It showed residents of Kyiv walking through one of the city's parks, admiring and enjoying the sight of the blooms unfurling on the magnolia trees in the late April sunshine. It was a remarkable image because, in the midst of the horror close by, it was a reminder of the power of God's creation to heal and strengthen us.

In straightened circumstances, Nature's resilience and recovery can be inspiring and optimistic. We are reminded of Anne Frank's diary, in which she wrote about how glimpsing the sky and a nearby chestnut tree from the attic window, gave her hope.

"Nearly every morning I go to the attic to blow the stuffy air out of my lungs, from my favourite spot on the floor I look up at the blue sky and the bare chestnut tree, on whose branches little raindrops shine, appearing like silver, and at the seagulls and other birds as they glide on the wind. As long as this exists, I thought, and I may live to see it, this sunshine, the cloudless skies, while this lasts I cannot be unhappy."

We know that Anne and her family, apart from her father, met a miserable fate, but while she was imprisoned in that attic, the sight of living things helped her. That tree was sadly felled by a storm in 2010, but because it inspired such hope, thousands of its saplings have been distributed and planted around the globe, to encourage others in difficult times.

When trees burst into leaf after a long, dark winter it always seems as if life is restored.

In Hamburg during the war, after the city was almost destroyed by British incendiary bombs in the summer of 1943, the sight of scorched and burnt trees sprouting green buds was said to feel like a miracle, giving the residents hope that their once prosperous city would one day be restored.

And while we, in our beautiful benefice, have not been incarcerated or bombed, we have all to some degree or another, endured challenges over the last two years. Maybe that is why, more than ever, we rejoiced at the sight of drifts of snowdrops early in the year, seas of bluebells more recently and will revel in the glory of gardens opening for charity throughout the summer. It is hard not to feel revitalised when walking through fresh green woodland in the lovely countryside, so beloved of Jane Austen, who wrote:

"To sit in the shade on a fine day, and look upon verdure is the most perfect refreshment."

We are very fortunate to be surrounded by stunning scenery and be reminded constantly of the beauty of nature described in Genesis: Then God said. "Let the earth sprout vegetation, plants yielding seed, and fruit trees on the earth bearing fruit after their kind with seed in them"; and it was so. The earth brought forth vegetation, plants yielding seed after their kind, and trees bearing fruit with seed in them, after their kind; and God saw that it was good.

Let us hope that we will always be able to look out of our windows and see that it is good and that, if troubles befall us, the sight of a magnolia tree in flower will give us hope.

Bentley CE Primary

French at Bentley CE Primary School

French has been taught at Bentley for many years, pre-dating the inclusion of a modern language as a statutory part of the KS2 curriculum in September 2014. It is currently taught by a primary language specialist who delivers weekly French lessons across the whole school each Wednesday. In addition, the children also have opportunities to learn other languages whilst at Bentley; Year 4 learn Spanish, Year 6 learn German and the whole school explore other languages as part of European Day of Languages celebrations in September.

French lessons at Bentley focus on building up all four language-learning skills: speaking, listening, writing and reading. The children learn a wide range of French, including language which they can use on holiday. Additionally, they develop independent skills, such as deciphering unknown language, which will be built on when they transfer to secondary school.

In Key Stage One the emphasis is on developing listening and speaking skills. The children very much enjoy using traditional stories, songs and games to learn French and are naturally brilliant at learning and retaining new language. In addition, from year 1 the children will also begin to develop skills in reading and writing. This includes copying a word to label a picture or reading a familiar word like numbers and days of the week.

From year 3 onwards, the children start lessons with speaking and listening activities. These focus on core questions and answers to build up the children's French conservational skills so that by the end of year 6, the children can hold a short conservation in French. They also learn how to construct sentences in French using a variety of structures. In Year 6 the children even write their own 'Barbapapa' stories and can write a paragraph about themselves from memory.

Primary languages is about making language-learning fun, relevant and important to inspire the children to become life-long language learners. In addition, learning a language also opens the children's eyes to other cultures as we explore the lives and traditions from France and the wider

Francophonie world and in our multicultural society this is very important.

'Learning a foreign language is a liberation from insularity and provides an opening to other cultures. A high-quality languages education should foster pupils' curiosity and deepen their understanding of the world.'

Early success for Binsted CC!

Hello folks

By the time you read this, the situation may have changed considerably. However, as I write in mid-May, I'm pleased to report that Binsted CC have enjoyed a strong start to the season. I'm sure we will right that ship soon enough...

As is now traditional, our first match was against Headley CC at the end of April, in the beautiful setting of the Bordon and Oakhanger Sport Club with its colonial-style clubhouse and white picket fences. Although not as sunny as it has been in previous years, it is always a lovely place to play. The game was decent enough too (although apparently not sufficiently decent to pull the team and supporters too far from the clubhouse bar) with Binsted setting Headley a total of 144 to chase. They eventually fell 20 runs short, giving Binsted a first 'W' of the 2022 campaign.

Our next game, on the bank holiday Sunday, was an absolute belter. Played at Tilford CC the second oldest cricket club in the country (according to the Tilford fixture card) and one of the most picturesque grounds in Surrey - the hosts batted first and set a challenging total of 240-5 in their 39 overs. Some determined batting from Ben Hinshelwood saw Binsted keep pace with the required run-rate in reply, ably assisted by debutant Tony de Sousa who nobly sacrificed a pair of his most cherished body parts in a bid to hold up one end. With the ball regularly disappearing into the surrounding streams, fields, and carparks, Binsted built strongly in the later stages and left themselves needing six from the final ball to tie the game. Hinshelwood duly obliged to finish on an incredible 134 not out and Binsted CC on 240-4 from 37 overs.

We then played a quite incredible match against Hawkley CC, our first game of the season at Binsted Rec. Binsted skipper Paul Knight won the toss – in itself an incredible outcome – and invited the opposition to bat first. And boy did they oblige. They batted, and batted, and batted, and finished on 255-4 after their allotted 35 overs. A tough total to chase – in fact the second highest total Binsted have ever been asked to chase.

A challenge on this scale calls for a re-think on tactics, and the team (in its widest sense) came together brilliantly to outfox the opposition. Jenney de Souza baked two dozen scones prematch, which beautifully complemented the many other goodies the team and their families had laid on for tea. Even though Hawkley had had their fill, our skipper ambled over to their table with a spare plate of scones and an extra tub of clotted cream, watching on, smirking, as they were duly polished off.

With severely depleted athleticism, Hawkley took to the field to defend their total but struggled to contain the Binsted openers Mike Perring, who finished unbeaten on 111 and Ben Homewood who smashed an imposing 85 before passing the baton to Ben Hinshelwood who came in at number 3. That was to be the only wicket that fell, as we finished on 256-1 with a couple of overs to spare. An incredible total and the highest aggregate score in Binsted CC's modern history. As well as the tea-time-tactics, credit must be given to the excellent condition of the wicket, which is thanks to the tireless work of Ron Neil and his occasionally-capable apprentice, John Dineen.

Our match on 15 May was unfortunately cancelled, as the opposition, Brook CC, could only find 4 players. Perhaps they had seen reports of our previous games and were running scared. I doubt it, but as a Binsted player you have to make hay while the sun shines, and enjoy moments like this!

By the time you read this, we should also have played Rowledge Casuals and The Irascibles. We will probably get bowled out for 47 in one match and score 312 in the other. That's the Binsted way. We will update you on progress next time.

We have also now started junior cricket on Friday evenings for the first time in 3 years, and it's great to be out there again. Everyone is welcome to join us up on the Rec, it's not just for cricketers and parents, we hope friends and neighbours from the village will come and join us whether it's for the BBQ, a beverage, the banter, or all three. The weather looks set fair for the next few weeks, so it stands to be a fantastic month ahead.

Juniper needs a tonic

The last of the ice ages ended twelve thousand years ago. Britain became an island around 6500 BC. The trees that had become established in the interim are described as 'native', while those that arrived later, largely with help from humans, are called 'non-native'.

Amongst the natives there are only three conifers; scots pine, yew and juniper. Scots pine and yew continue to flourish. Juniper is in trouble.

It is facing extinction in southern Britain. Across our downlands, this iconic shrub has failed to regenerate for the past sixty years, and as bushes reach the end of their lives, whole colonies are dying out. It has been lost from nearly 50% of its historic range. Should this trend continue, over 100 specialist invertebrates and fungi will disappear too. Now, to add to its woes, the larger upland population in the north and Scotland is threatened by a fungus, *phytophthora austrocedri*, which attacks the roots initially and thence kills the plant within a few years. It is likely that the disease has been here for some time, perhaps over 30 years.

Juniper, juniperus communis, is an evergreen perennial coniferous shrub or small tree with narrow-linear tough leaves. There is a wide variety of growth forms from a horizontal creeping mat to tall columnar spikes. Plants are either male or female. It can live to well over 100 years and may form a distinctive scrub community or, in the north, it is found in the understorey in open Scots pine woodland. Its 'berries' (actually modified cones) and shoots provide a valuable food source for wild birds and mammals and can be added to obnoxious raw spirit, otherwise suitable only as hand sanitiser, transforming it into ever-fashionable gin.

Pollination occurs by wind in the spring: male bushes produce small pollen cones whilst the cones of female bushes carry receptive droplets of fluid. Fertilised cones develop into berry-like fruits which ripen two or three years after pollination. Dispersal is mainly via migrant thrushes in the autumn. Although its seed is deeply dormant, requiring two cold winters to germinate, it appears only to remain viable in the soil for a few years. Seedlings take 4-9 years to reach sexual maturity.

Particularly in southern England regeneration of juniper bushes is reduced by the make-up of the populations. Many consist of similar aged bushes that responded to suitable conditions for growth at the same time in the past and at some sites are either all male or all female reducing the opportunity for reproduction where populations are sparsely spread across a landscape. The population therefore has a critical mass below which it will inevitably decline.

Most junipers live on chalk downland or limestone grassland in southern England. It is considered a pioneer species; its seedlings need bare ground to establish and are readily outcompeted due to their slow growth. There is a major project in progress to reinstate lost juniper landscapes on a larger scale, focusing initially on the Wylye Valley in Wiltshire and the 'Berkshire' Downs in Oxfordshire. But you don't have to go all the way to Wiltshire to find chalk or limestone, you can find it round here too. Juniperus communis can be bought relatively cheaply from reputable UK and Ireland suppliers (to minimise the risk of importing and spreading tree pests and diseases). Seeds must be collected and stored in the UK and Ireland, and they should all be coded so that each individual tree can be tracked

We're making progress! In February we won Tree Council funding and planted a new hedge. We've now been awarded funding by South Downs National Park, for a 'BeeLines' pollinator project.

To celebrate progress - and midsummer - we're holding a Community Picnic at the fields.

Everyone's invited! There will be a honeytasting and activities for children. It's free to attend, and there's no need to book - but do check the parish council Events calendar for parking details and any wet weather alerts (we'll re-locate to the Jolly Farmer skittle alley if wet!)

Binsted parish council remains critically short of councillors, despite relentless recruitment attempts over the past year. We urgently need your help.

We have a lovely team, which gets on well. But we should have nine councillors, and we only

have five. This situation cannot continue. The current councillors are under great pressure. And meetings struggle to be quorate, which makes life difficult for our Clerk. Unless more help can be found very soon, we will have to cut back on various community projects that we've scoped. We may also be approaching the point of considering a more drastic solution, such as merging with another council.

We're looking for people who care about our local area: Parish councils are places where ordinary people come together to make decisions about issues they care about: protecting the environment, keeping facilities in good repair, improving local services ... ordinary people giving some time to the community. It doesn't matter if you're in work, at-home, retired, or a young person seeking volunteer experience. If you're interested in finding out what being a councillor involves, please ring me, or call in to Binsted Sports Pavilion to chat with Lisa Spindler, our Parish Clerk (Mon-Thurs, 09:00-15:00). We're also interested in hearing from you if you cannot contemplate becoming a councillor but could volunteer to help with specific tasks. For example: helping with traffic speed monitoring; joining the new Holt Pound Working Group; joining

the 'Friends of Blacknest Fields' group; or helping with schools liaison.


It has been a long time since the musical world has felt it can wholeheartedly sing out but on Saturday 2nd July, Luminosa will do just that in a vibrant concert proclaiming the cultural richness of Africa, and people who are diverse by just about any measure.

The entire family of Luminosa choirs will perform together for the first time since the pandemic in a concert that crosses boundaries and celebrates what unites rather than divides people. The programme will showcase Alexander L'Estrange's Zimbe, a sequence of choral arrangements of traditional songs in jazz style. And since jazz grew out of blues which itself sprang from the mouths of African people, what better accompaniment for these songs than a jazz quintet composed of drums, bass, keyboard, saxophone and copious auxiliary percussion.

Fresh from their success at the Basingstoke Music Festival, in which both choirs took first place with distinctions, Luminosa Young Voices and Luminosa Rising Voices, enthusiastically led by Jonathan Upfold and Joshua Robinson respectively, will perform two joyous pieces alongside the adult choir. Alexander L'Estrange shares Luminosa's mission to give children a chance to sing in exciting concerts and venues outside school and grow in confidence and choral autonomy. This work gives young singers their own vocal line, which is fun, empowering and leads to a performance they will remember forever.

Alexander L'Estrange started his own musical career as a young chorister which launched his fascination for all musical genres. Together with his wife (singer and arranger, Joanna Forbes), he played with The Swingle Singers from 1999-2004. His affinity with African music was established serendipitously in a chance encounter on a train with a woman on her way to run a workshop in a prison. She had many African gospel songs she was keen to teach and share but confessed to lacking confidence in leading a singing workshop. He offered to help and the rest, as they say, is history. Alexander l'Estrange's love

affair with African music was forged, particularly the manifold wavs in which music plays a part in everyday life in that vast continent. Zimbe (meaning 'Sing them') bears witness to the



spirited, energetic and simple way that is typical of the African song tradition. According to the composer, the act of singing and listening to Zimbe is a communion between people in a realm where music imitates life and life inspires music'.

Zimbe touches the emotions. It is at times moving and at other times funky and grooving but all the time uplifting for performers and audiences alike. The excitement, verve and energy are all distinctly African, including the syncopation and contemporary jazz improvisatory styles which are the perfect serotonin hit for a summer's evening.

Luminosa Voices will be conducted by their gifted and enthusiastic choral director, Rebekah Abbott, with pianist Adam Blosse and jazz ensemble of hand-picked professional musicians.

Zimbe and other musical inspirations from the African continent will be performed on Saturday 2nd July at St Peter's Church, Petersfield at the slightly earlier time of 7pm. Tickets are just £15 for adults (under 12s-£5), available on Ticket Source www.luminosamusic.com

BOOK REVIEWS

Author of the month: Simon Jones

Simon Jones is a journalist who became an ordained minister of the church, a lecturer in theology and a Vice-Principal of a London theological college.

Book of the month:

"Discovering The New Testament", Publisher: Crossway Books, Leicester, 1994, 2001, paperback, 216 pages.

At the time of writing, good copies are available from www.bookfinder.com from £2.24 including postage and packing.

"When was the last time you read the New Testament? I mean really read it. ... Indeed, have you ever read the New Testament as it was intended to be read ...?"

This is how Simon Jones begins his very readable introduction to the New Testament. He encourages us to take a Gospel, Acts or a letter - and read it through at one sitting. They are, he reminds us, "gripping stories from the frontline of the Christian faith."

Simon's book consists of two parts. Part one has 12 chapters with short outlines of each of the 27 books in the New Testament. Part two ("The essential New Testament user's guide") has 11 chapters ranging from "Jesus' world" to "A standard to live by."

This reviewer has read quite a number of "introductions to the New Testament." "Discovering The New Testament" is up with the best of them! Whether you prefer the Gospels to St. Paul's letters, or the other way round, this book will help you discover the facts, find your way through the story, and get to the heart of the story.

The final page of the book reminds us that the formal list of the 27 books making up the New Testament was drawn up in the 4th century. It was then that the church formally recognized what the Holy Spirit had been telling them for some time. "These books are special. Read them, trust them, live by them." Happy reading!
