Benefice Letter

It has been said that if you want to understand a nation, then you need to know the sport that they play. Whether it's pétangue, sumo or cricket, these sports reveal the values and preferences of different cultures. Great Britain has been responsible for developing a large number of sports that have been taken up internationally, but perhaps the most idiosyncratic of these is cricket and I would say especially the 5-day format where teams compete in variable weather and deteriorating playing surfaces to showcase the range of skills, concentration and moments of inspiration that make, for me, cricket so compelling.

This summer, we play host to the contest between Australia and England for the Ashes, a small urn representing "death of English cricket" when beaten for the first time by Australia in 1882 at the Oval. I will listen enthralled to the matchless commentary of Test Match Special (when I can!) as the story of this competition is slowly revealed.

I recently came across a quote from Douglas Jardine, the England captain of the notorious "Bodyline" tour of Australia of 1932/3 who said, "Cricket is battle and service and sport and art." That really struck me as a very apt description, not only of cricket, but also perhaps of life.

As we live, we are in a constant struggle to chose how we want to live. Whether to be self-centred, focussed on meeting my own wants and needs above any consideration of others, or whether to be altruistic and looking to enable others to meet their needs too. Writ large, these choices for nations can mean the difference between war and co-operation.

Serving others and working together to achieve a cherished aim are mong the most satisfying aspects of life. Building community, family and relationships with a range of people with different experiences and knowledge from ourselves, who enrich and deepen our own lives.

Sport perhaps is the weakest link to a manifesto of life, but even here, the choices are about choosing to obey the agreed/ received rules of behaviour. They provide a level footing for all, but if abused or stretched to breaking point, then something precious is lost.

Life as art might be seen to be stretching things too far. Yet, I would contend that a life well lived, with deep committed relationships to others sharing the deepest challenges and celebrating the highest



Prayer Week 2023 Courage in the Face of Change



Anti-social behaviour and criminal activity in Bentley



It is regretful to report that we are seeing a rise in vandalism and anti-social behaviour (ASB) in Bentley village over the past couple of months; with beautiful weather comes not-so-beautiful conduct by a small minority. This has included loud boisterous behaviour in the evenings, along with littering and vandalism to property, particularly around the Recreation Ground and Business Park.

Over the same period we have also witnessed the theft of two vehicles from outside residents' homes in the village. These thefts are worrying and we hope it does not mark the beginning of an increase in criminal activity in Bentley.

We have expressed our concern to the police and recently met with our community police officer, PCSO Jessica Ponsford. With immediate effect, she has agreed to increase evening patrols through the village.

PCSO Ponsford also asked that we advise residents to report ASB or any suspicious activity by calling 101. She told us that the more incidents that are reported the more police support will be forthcoming. Therefore, we ask you to make use of this service and report suspicious activity or incidents of ASB.

Finally, to address the littering issue on the Recreation Ground, we are in contact with Norse to try and increase the bin collections, but it would be most helpful if people could take their litter home with them if they see that the bins are full.

Hi folks - hope you're having a fabulous summer?

As I write this in early June, the wet weather that blighted the early part of the season has been replaced with blue skies and sunshine. The cricket has picked up too. After a difficult opening game against Tilford and another loss against local rivals the Rowledge Casuals, Binsted CC bounced back with two strong wins and we are now chomping at the bit for our next match.

Rowledge Casuals was a disappointing result, where Binsted struggled to make inroads into a strong batting line up and allowed the opposition to post 220-2 in their 35 overs. In the Binsted innings, too many wickets were given away too cheaply and we never threatened to get close, finishing on 170-9 with top scores in the 30s from Will Cronk, Scott Sanderson and Jonny Mitchell.

The next game was organised at short notice against Odiham & Greywell, the first time the two clubs have played each other. This time the batting performance was much improved with most players contributing and Will Cronk and Huw Ross retiring on 50+runs, leaving Binsted with 208-5 from their 35 overs.

The Binsted bowlers ripped into the visiting batters from the off and they never recovered, finishing on 106 all out after 24 overs. Jay Patel, who took two wickets in two balls in the first over and 3-18 overall, led the attack brilliantly with several others bowlers chipping in, including debutants Michael Knight and Tom Norsworthy with one apiece.

The following week, the batting form continued away at Medstead. On a lighting fast outfield with short boundaries, the Binsted batters tucked and sprayed 4s and 6s to all parts. Three players retired on 50+ runs (Will Cronk, Huw Ross and Ben Krempel) and Kieran Cook finished on 46 not out, setting Medstead a mammoth 283-4 from 35 overs.

The bowlers were also on form again with 6 players, including the irrepressible James Dineen, taking at least one wicket, limiting Medstead to 130 all out. While early record keeping for BCC was decidedly sketchy, the club statistician suggests this may be the largest winning margin (153) we have recorded since 're-forming' in 2015.

Long may the good form continue – and it will need to! We have a few tough fixtures coming up in June and into next month, leading up to our club tour to Weymouth on 14-16 July.

Before we sign off for this month, a quick reminder that EVERYONE IS WELCOME to join us at the Rec for our Friday Night Socials every week at 6.30pm. There is a BBQ and Bar with Senior and Junior cricket practice & coaching, and the Croquet club will be there too. You don't need to be a member of the clubs and you don't need to play, you can join in as much or as little as you wish.

A friend of mine who lives in Scotland came south recently (to get warmed up I suppose) and told me he was impressed by the amount of mistletoe he had seen growing in the trees. He said he never sees it where he lives.

It's very common round here. For instance, as you drive between Holt Pound and Bucks Horn Oak on the A325 you see large, spherical clumps high in the trees. The most prominent example I have seen grows on a tall tree at the front corner of the Bat and Wicket property, in front of the Holt Pound Oval. Most fittingly the host tree is a cricket bat willow! Even in high summer the mistletoe is clearly

visible through the willow's foliage. It is evergreen, so it sticks out like a giant sore thumb in the winter.

There are many species around the world, but the only one you'll see growing wild here is *viscum album*, European mistletoe. <u>Unlike</u> ivy, mistletoe is parasitic, or, more precisely, *hemiparasitic*. That is to say

the seedlings can survive stuck to the branches of their hosts for the first year, but, to grow to full size, they need to tap into the host sapwood and draw water and nutrients from there. This is because they have incomplete systems for photosynthesis.

People can become seriously ill from eating the familiar white berries. They contain the toxin viscumin, a ribosome inactivating protein, abbreviated ominously to RIP. Some birds have immunity to the poison and enjoy the berries, especially the mistle thrush which is named for its favourite food.

With all this you'd hardly expect it to be particularly popular with the human race. And, as usual, you'd be wrong. What you see at Christmas with people kissing under the mistletoe is a mere vestige of its former importance. One practice with the kissing business, that thankfully seems to have been dropped. was that with each exchanged kiss the beau plucked a berry from the bunch. Of course nowadays, knowing the toxicity of the berries, Health and Safety would put a stop to that, wouldn't they?

Going back past the Victorians, who, after all, invented Christmas as we know it, then the importance of mistletoe to medicine and spirituality expands.

According to Pliny the Elder, the Celts considered it a remedy for barrenness in animals and an antidote to poison,

and sacred when growing on oak trees (where it is rare). He describes a Celtic ritual sacrifice and banquet at which a druid dressed in white would climb an oak tree to collect mistletoe using a golden sickle. This legend is often referred to in the popular Asterix comic books, where the druid Getafix is often seen collecting mistletoe with a golden sickle.

According to the 13th century German Prose Edda, the goddess Frigg had everything and everyone swear an oath not to hurt her son Baldr, except for mistletoe, because "it seemed too young" to her for that. After this at the thing, other gods had fun by shooting at him, or hurling stones, without him being injured at all. Loki, wishing him dead, tricked Baldr's brother, the blind god Höðr into throwing mistletoe at Baldr, killing him. I suppose the best part of that story is the message -'avoid mistletoe'.

Winston Graham, novelist creator of 'Poldark', reports a Cornish tradition that mistletoe was originally a fine tree from which the wood of the Cross was made. but afterwards it was condemned to live on only as a parasite.

Who knows.

The Binsted Spire Saga still requires £40,000

As reported in recent months, the repair work to the church spire is on-going and the costs have increased yet again due to the challenges of working on the century's old oak timbers on the spire to securely install the new weathervane.

Consequently, our costs have increased by almost £10,000 in the last six weeks.

The replacement weathervane, identical in design but made from more durable materials, has been fabricated.

We have also treated sections of the spire for deathwatch beetle and we still have to lay tiles on the floor of the bell tower.

Thanks to all of you who have already donated towards our appeal. We have raised over £15,000, which is an incredible start.

Unfortunately, with the extended timelines and the additional the costs have increased, so our fundraising target has increased to £50,000, leaving us, now, just over £40,000 still to raise.





If you haven't done so yet, please will you support this village project to fully restore the tower and spire, and then we can start to improve the church facilities.

Our church is quite a landmark, the highest point in Hampshire, a grade 1 listed building built in 12th Century, and it belongs to us all.

Every week the scaffolding is up, the more expensive the project becomes, so we are progressing as fast as we can to complete the work. We hope to remove the scaffolding and the safety enclosure in July, returning the graveyard back to normal for the first time in over a year.




What's new at Binsted Parish Council?
