Benefice Letter

Who is the greatest person in history?

A mighty conqueror or ruler of a massive empire, like Genghis Khan or Queen Victoria? An artist able to manipulate shape and form, like Leonardo Da Vinci or Michelangelo? A thinker able to inspire millions and shape societies, like Karl Marx or Aristotle? Or someone with outstanding compassion and care like Mother Theresa or Mahatma Ghandhi? A few years ago, there was a poll to find the greatest Briton, and our very own Alfred the Great was beaten by Winston Churchill in the final vote.

Who would you say the greatest person in history is?

For me, one person stands alone above all other candidates. Jesus. He rules over the hearts and minds of the largest religion ever seen in history, across every continent and with devoted followers prepared to even risk certain death in their loyalty. He performed miracles with his hands, feeding, healing, caring in works of artistry changing the very lives of those he touched, far more than being moved by a beautiful painting or sculpture. His teachings form the bedrock of our society, that it is the duty of the strong to protect the weak, that all people are born with the inherent dignity of carrying the image of God, that to forgive is far better than to demand for justice, that all of us have made mistakes and are not worthy to cast the first stone to condemn others. His compassion and care inspired others to the build schools, hospitals, hospices and yes even churches.

2000 years after his death and resurrection, Jesus inspires, comforts and confronts us. He once asked his disciples who they thought he was, and Peter replied, "You are the Christ, the Son of God." He accepts these titles and calls Peter blessed for having this insight and understanding. Christianity seems to be on the wane in the West, but in the global south, Africa, Asia and Latin America the church is growing at an exponential rate. We carry the legacy of our Christian history in the roots of our society as the historian, Tom Holland describes in his book "Dominion". Lazily, religion is often cast as in opposition to science in the media, but a look at history shows how many of the greatest minds and scientists were devout Christians "thinking God's thoughts after him" as Einstein put it.

Who is Jesus to you? A figure from history? An irrelevance? The Son of God? Jesus makes extraordinary claims, which, if true, make him the most important person for us to understand and make up our minds about. He said, *"I am the Way, the Truth and the Life. No one comes to the Father, except through me."* John 14:6.

Notes from the Tower

The villagers of Bentley may have heard the bells ringing out on a Monday evening for the last few months.

As part of a nationwide drive to recruit for the Coronation we at Bentley had a large number of new learners join us from across the area.

Bellringing requires a number of hours to handle a bell (it's one thing you can't learn from a book or by watching a video) and it's only recently our latest recruits have started to ring unaided in 'rounds' or as someone recently put...'the wedding sound'.

What's amazing with our exercise and referring back to the Coronation of King Charles and Queen Camilla, the bells have rung out for every Monarch since Queen Anne in 1702. The same sound then is the identical sound heard today and that's one of the unique features that bells and bellringing provides.

Ringers span in age from 8 to well over 80! Ringers come from all walks of life and it's a great leveller. We have some famous people amongst our ranks! A very popular TV gardening expert lives close-by and enjoys ringing when time permits. Other famous ringers include a number of well known TV comedians and presenters, a scattering of politicians, a Strictly contestant! an ex Prime Ministers wife and not forgetting the late Victoria Wood and Poet Laureate Sir John Betjeman.

If you've ever thought of giving it a go, we have places available to train. We are at St. Mary's Bentley on a Monday from 7pm to 8.30pm they have ringing at Binsted on Thursday evenings from 7.30pm and Froyle on Fridays from 6.30pm and Saturday mornings at Holybourne.

Our towers belong to the Winchester snd Portsmouth Diocesan Guild of Church Bellringers, where there's over 1500 members from across Hampshire. Our district, called 'Alton & Petersfield' last week held a practice at Winchester Cathedral. Evidently it was the largest number of bellringers in the huge ringing chamber ever recorded with 78 attending. With the nights drawing in, the thoughts of trying something new, bellringing is a great workout for your body and mind. Many ringers well into their 80's are active busy working on their sequences whilst ringing or thinking of heading down the pub after a practice!

On entering a ringing chamber you will have instant friends, guaranteed! You can visit any church tower across the country and be welcomed.

Although we can't be seen we are very much heard and the glorious sounds pealed out we hope send a message that we call people to our churches, they are alive and well, they are at the heart of a community and that our sound delivers a sense of tradition that remains unchanged in an ever changing world.

We look forward to seeing you and hopefully you hearing regularly from us!





Maintaining Binsted's Rights of Way

Summer returned at the beginning of September, keeping the volunteers of the Binsted Rights of Way team busy with fast-growing vegetation on the footpaths and bridleways of the parish. We had some good news that Hampshire's Countryside Services have approved our request for funding for training on the use of the two electric brushcutters that the team currently has available. At present, only one member of the team has the required training certificate, so it will be really great to be able to spread the load more evenly across the volunteers.

In the last few issues of this magazine, I have mentioned the newly resurfaced section of Bridleway 62 between its eastern end in Frith End and the end of the Straits Inclosure. This major work was kindly funded by grants from a variety of local organisations, pulled together by the British Horse Society. The official opening ceremony took place on the Bridleway on 6th September. The reopened Bridleway is proving a great hit with local residents and visitors alike, walkers, horse riders and cyclists. Sights are now set on achieving something similarly transformative, but more modest in scale, for another of the local Bridleways which is blighted by a section of deep mud.

The newly resurfaced part of Bridleway 62 looks so impressive, it made the unimproved sections of the same bridleway seem narrow and congested with vegetation by comparison. So, the Binsted volunteers joined forces with Megan, our HCC Community Ranger, to tackle the next section, which was seriously overgrown with brambles, blackthorn and long grass. At the western end, there is a small bridge across the stream. Looking at the before and after photos, it is almost impossible to see even the handrail of the bridge on the "before", let alone the bridge itself! The "after" is a revelation, showing a comfortably usable, wide path across the bridge, through the trees and bushes to the next stetch of bridleway up to Wheatley. How satisfying is that?

By the way, look out for Alton's Autumn Walking Festival, which runs from 16th to 22nd October this year. The Festival hosts a wide variety of walks led by knowledgeable volunteers, some of them members of the Binsted Rights of Way team. There are a variety of walks to suit all abilities and tastes – short strolls or long walks, town walks and family walks, with a number of themed walks, covering foraging, ghosts, trees and more. All walks must be booked and this process started during September – check out the Walk Alton website for details and availability. The Binsted volunteers are regularly inspecting the parish's paths, but if you would like to report a problem on any of the Binsted Rights of Way, whether it is a fallen tree, a broken stile, a collapsed fingerpost or simply some overgrown vegetation, you can do so online on the Hampshire "Report a problem on a right of way" page - this requires you to create an account and log in to the site first. Alternatively, you can use the volunteer team's own email address to do so - it is BinstedRoW@gmail.com. One final way of reporting a Rights of Way problem is to do so on the Binsted Community Facebook group. The volunteer team will try to identify problems reported there and deal with them promptly if we can in all cases, please give as much location information as possible.



The Lady of the Woods

...or so Samuel Taylor Coleridge described the birch.

But which birch? We have two native species in England – the silver birch *Betula pendula* and the downy birch *B pubescens*. Since they grow pretty much anywhere, and freely hybridise, they can be difficult to tell apart. What is unmistakable is the white bark, which gives the silver birch its name, but also marks out all birches from anything else.

These are tough trees, and intrepid too. They are called pioneer trees. They will have been among the first to colonise Britain after the ice age. To this day they are the only tree native to Iceland. And those long shots of birch forest in '*Doctor Zhivago*' are true to life. I've seen them as I drove for hours through the Russian countryside (a long time ago, in perestroika times). And yet they are nowhere near as long-lived as some other of our natives. They struggle to attain a hundred years. It's as if they'd rather die young and beautiful. It's popular these days to make the link between this tree and any silver anniversary. Alton will soon be welcoming visitors from the Italian twinned town of Montecchio Maggiore. The plan is to plant a *Betula pendula*, probably in the Flood Meadows, to commemorate twenty five years of association. In my own family we planted one such in the garden of my in laws on their special day.

Not so common these days is the use of birch branches to make a witch's broom, although there has been resurgence since the publishing of a series of very successful children's books. All I would say is, please make sure the birch branches are firmly lashed to the hazel handle to avoid any unfortunate detachments, and, hence, loss of motive power. Both downy and silver varieties have small, heart-shaped leaves on slender stalks, which means the leaves droop even if the branches don't. In the gentlest breeze they will rustle as if there is a shower on the way.

Every healthy tree will bear both male and female catkins. The females will fruit, producing loads of tiny, winged seeds, looking like aphids, to be carried away far from mother-father and the competition for light and nutrition.

Like all our native trees, people have discovered a wealth of ways to use every part of the plant. It was believed to be a particularly effective wood for driving out malevolent spirits. Even in my lifetime some reactionaries still advocated 'bringing back the birch' as a form of punishment for misdemeanours. Perhaps less savage, but based on the same belief set, it was the wood of choice for 'beating the bounds', that is demarking the boundaries of each parish.

The bark yields a black tar which was one of the first glues known to man. When the remains of a Neolithic 'ice man' were discovered in the Alps, the tools in his rucksack showed traces of this tar.

Now an extract from the bark known as betulinic acid is exciting modern pharmaceutical interest.

But surely birch's longest and strongest hold on us has been its association with fertility and childbirth. The rituals and the talismans are numerous, but the most commonplace has been the maypole, made from a tall straight bole of birch:

'At the top of the pole were crossed hoops decked with small flowers; beneath these came a milk-white zone of Maybloom; then came a zone of bluebells, then of cowslips, then of lilacs, then of ragged robins, daffodils and so on, till the lowest stage was reached.' – Thomas Hardy, The return of the native, 1878.

What's new at **Binsted Parish Council**?

Parish Priority Statement

Thanks to everyone who completed our parish survey this summer – and well done to Jo Hallett, who won the prize draw! Your responses have given us a good cross section of views of how you'd like the parish to evolve over the coming years. Our 'Local Plan Working Group' is now using your survey responses to draft Binsted's 'Parish Priority Statement', ready for submission to the South Downs National Park Authority on 20 October. If you're interested in this topic, you're welcome to join our 10 October council meeting, when the draft will be discussed and finalised. The final version will be published on our website after 20 October.

Traffic

Many parts of the parish suffered clogged roads and tailbacks during the Jalsa Salana festival in July; and further chaos in August, when A31 westbound closed for resurfacing and HGVs made ill-advised detours through narrow lanes. Further major works lie ahead: Bordon's electricity grid is getting a major upgrade, which means the B3304 will be closed from Sleaford to Alton for 6+ months in 2024

To help ensure that local concerns get properly factored into future plans, we are joining traffic planning liaison meetings, both for the electricity grid work, and for Jalsa Salana. We'll use our Facebook site (https://www.facebook.com/BinstedParish/) to keep you updated and share useful information.

Bridleway 62 - transformed!

The 'Grand Opening' of Bridleway 62 took place in September, celebrating the completion of the second and final phase of resurfacing work. Known for many years as 'the Dire Straits', the bridleway through Frith End's 'Straits Inclosure' was previously famous for its impassable mud, even in high summer. It's fantastic that this route has now been completely resurfaced and is now an absolute pleasure to use. Big thanks to the British Horse Society who led fundraising efforts to bring about this much-needed transformation.



Accidents at Bentley Crossroads



During this summer Bentley Parish Council have held meetings and corresponded with Hants Highways in an effort to, hopefully, bring an end to the spate of traffic accidents at Bentley Crossroads. As many of you will be aware the most recent accident, on 30th July, brought to everyone's attention the danger, not only to motorists but also, to pedestrians.

At the beginning of June, following earlier accidents, the Parish Council met with Hants Highways. We discussed the potential causes of these accidents and outlined a number of actions that could improve the junction. In a meeting last week, after further correspondence, we discussed causal analysis work that the County Council's traffic and safety teams have performed through their access to the Police's accident database. Their conclusion is that the majority of contributing factors in the current Bentley Crossroads accident record do not relate to the layout of the junction. However, they have proposed a number of changes and repairs that will raise the visibility of the junction for traffic approaching from all four directions.

These improvements will be to signing and road markings. At our Parish Council meeting this week councillors reviewed and approved the proposed changes, and Hants Highways will now begin work. In terms of the order of the works, the aim is to implement the signing first with the line marking following as soon as achievable thereafter. We are hopeful that these works can commence within the next two months, although some of the work is weather dependent.
