Benefice Letter

80 years ago this month, Russian Soviet troops entered Kyiv and the German army retreated. The German advance had been halted at Stalingrad at huge cost to both sides during the harsh Russian winter. Now in a fighting retreat, the Germans were being pushed out of what had been Russian territory. It is a cruel irony that 80 years later, independent Ukraine is fighting for its survival against Russian armies. Many Ukrainians had joined the German army, as there was no love lost towards Stalin especially after the terrible events of 1932-3, where Stalin had requisitioned unreasonable amounts of Ukrainian grain. In the terrible famine that followed, known as the Holodomor, between 3.5 and 5 million Ukrainians died as a direct result of Soviet policy.

Vladimir Putin, in describing the modern Ukrainian state as being "Nazi", is deliberately reminding the Russian people of the cost of life that it took to rid Russian soil of German invaders. The "Great Patriotic War", as the Second World War is known in Russia, is invoked to inspire the sacrifice and struggle of the Russian people. The war is thus as much ideological, as it is a brazen attempt at grabbing land and destroying a neighbouring state.

The poet Steve Turner says, "History repeats itself. It has to. Noone listens."

As we gather for Remembrance Day this year, we remember with pride and sadness, the young men from our villages who died in the world wars to defend the freedoms we enjoy and to counter tyranny and evil. We rightly should honour their memory, and as the Rolls of Honour are read out, we are reminded of local people uprooted from these beautiful Hampshire hills, and who died on land, at sea and in the air. Their sacrifice, and the hard-won victories must be remembered, so that history does not repeat itself again.

In the book of Psalms in the Bible, several songs are included that call the people to remember the faithlessness and failures of the past, as well as the great

It also is not a celebration of nationalism, but an intimate local event fulfilling the epitaph written on the Kohima monument in India.

"When you go home. Tell them of us and say, for your tomorrow, we gave our today."

May we give our todays to work for the peace and prosperity of the human race, to call out injustice and tyranny, and protect the weak and vulnerable. May the God of peace surround you, and fill your hearts and homes with his peace. Never forgetting that it is through sacrifice, that we can live.





The London Plane is a real city slicker, and the capital's most common tree.

We know that trees do more than just capture carbon to fight the cruel effects of a changing climate. They also help:

Prevent flooding
Reduce city temperature
Reduce pollution
Keep soil nutrient-rich

The London Plane is a star when it comes to reducing pollution and providing shade.

The origins of London plane (*Platanus x hispanica*), a hybrid between Oriental (*P. orientalis*) and Western plane, or buttonwood (*P. occidentalis*), are uncertain but most likely happened in the 1600's in Spain. It was first planted in England around 1680 at Ely in Cambridgeshire, and at Barnes in Surrey and both trees are still there today, the latter one going by the name of Barnie. There is a huge specimen, thought to be the largest of its kind in Britain, in Mottisfont Garden, and forms part of the National Collection of plane trees which stand in the grounds. Capability Brown was very fond of them for his grand garden designs, and none grander than Petworth House.

Planting of the new hybrid across London started in the late 18th century and by the 1920's London plane represented around 60% of the trees in London though that has now dropped significantly. They are still common in cities and parks across Europe, Asia, South Africa and North America, in part because they are adept at trapping particulates such as airborne pollutants on both bark and leaf hairs and can survive in very poor compacted ground. However, they can grow to a considerable size; 'Barnie' was measured in 2017 and was then 35.2m tall and had a girth of 9m!

Planes are not native to the UK, but Oriental plane is found across south-east Europe, Asia, and India. They have simple palmately lobed (handshaped) leaves arranged alternately along the shoot. After pollination by wind, female flowers develop into spiky fruits, comprising a dense cluster of seeds with stiff hairs, which aid dispersal by wind. The fruits slowly break up over winter, to release their seeds, long after the leaves have fallen. Mature trees have distinctive bark which sheds in patches to give an attractive

camouflage-style appearance though on old trees the trunk develops a more evenly coloured appearance.

According to the London Tree Report, the London plane tree is one of the most 'important species' in Inner London (but not Greater London) along with birch (*Betula spp*), lime (*Tilia spp*.) and apple (*Malus spp*.). The report also notes that London plane trees make up the largest leaf area of all tree species in Inner London, potentially bringing the most benefits for air quality and shade.

The wood used to be popular for making veneers called 'lacewood', as it is an attractive golden-brown colour with dark brown flecks.

Since it only arrived here in more enlightened times, there is no English folklore associated with planes. The Roman naturalist, Pliny the Elder, found them commonly around him,

and was able to recommend that the seeds, pounded with vinegar and honey, removed 'freckles, cancerous sores and chronic pustules on the neck'. Well, anything's worth a try, isn't it?

In Dickens' A Tale of Two Cities, Lucie Manette sits with her ageing father beneath a plane tree growing close to their lodgings in Soho Square. They watch the moon rise through the branches and then Lucie sees her father safely to bed.

'So, the sunrise came, and the shadows of the leaves of the plane-tree moved upon his face, as softly as her lips had moved in praying for him.'

Don't we need more London planes round here?

Binsted Parish Council – planning matters

When people talk about parish councils, it's most often about their involvement in the planning system. For good or bad!

This is a quick update on some of the recent planning activities in which Binsted's parish council has been involved; and to highlight that we're still seeking help from parishioners willing to give the council a hand with planning matters.

Planning decisions affect peoples' lives and the value of land. The planning system tries to balance private interests in developing land against wider public interests.

For big complex planning applications, parish councils' role is mainly to act as a liaison point for local communities and, occasionally, to represent our area at planning hearings.

- In September, we spoke at the Regulatory Committee for Veolia's Anaerobic
 Digester application which, although of less concern than the previous
 incinerator application, still causes various local worries. Although HCC
 unanimously approved this application, we were glad we spoke, to highlight
 issues with potential smells, traffic, screening and so forth, and to ensure
 these concerns are documented and included in future monitoring and
 in the remit of the Liaison Committee that will be set up, in which Binsted
 hopes to play an active part.
- During October, we have been focused on responding to Farnborough
 Airport's plans to increase its numbers of flights by 40%. Our rural area is
 already suffering disproportionately from aircraft noise, due to our location
 on Farnborough's recently introduced flightpaths, in combination with rises in
 air traffic already happening at Farnborough. We feel it is important to ensure
 that dispersed rural communities' concerns about aircraft noise are heard
 in the wider debate about airport growth, particularly given the upcoming
 consultation about the national 'Airspace Modernisation Strategy', which plans
 to double UK aircraft flights by 2030.

Smaller planning applications can also be contentious. The simple fact is that a parish council is not the decision maker, and our comments only count as a single voice when planning authorities tot up the number of objections or expressions of support. However, to make it easier for you to spot planning applications, Binsted Parish Council's website automatically shows South Downs and EHDC applications; and we're also trialling sharing them on Facebook. Do contact the Clerk if you see an application you're concerned about - although quite a few planning applications inevitably fall into the 'we'd rather it didn't happen but there's no valid policy reason to object' pile.

Local Plans and Neighbourhood Plans provide frameworks for long-term development, taking account of residents' views about how they'd like their local area to evolve.

- Binsted's first 'Parish Priority Statement' has recently been completed and submitted to South Downs National Park. It's on the Binsted Parish Council website, if you'd like to take a look. Thanks again to everyone who completed our summer survey to give your inputs to this.
- Details of EHDC's new Local Plan are expected to become known during November. We'll need to see how it fits with our Parish Priority Statement and with SDNP's Local Plan updates. (We're always navigating the complication that Binsted parish has two planning authorities).

Can you help? We'd love to hear from anyone with a background or interest in planning, to reinforce the council's expertise in this important area. Please get in touch for a chat!
