## **Benefice Letter**

I must admit that I am always slightly envious of Wales, Scotland and Ireland. I'm not talking about rugby and the 'Six Nations', although that last minute drop goal to win against Ireland was poetry to this Englishman!

Instead, I am envious of their patron saints. Scotland has St. Andrew, one of the disciples of Jesus, but it is highly unlikely that he travelled from Palestine to northern Britain, before going back to Greece to meet his martyrdom by crucifixion. Wales has St. David, bishop and inspiring leader of his countrymen during the time of unrest and violence caused by Viking raids. Finally, Ireland has St. Patrick, credited with bringing Christianity to Ireland and ridding it of snakes.

England? Well we have St. George to celebrate on 23rd April. St. George (probably!) never fought a dragon, which is the only thing most people know about him. This legend began to circulate about 800 years after his death. St. George is remarkably busy as a patron saint, as well as England; he also is said to look after Georgia, Malta, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Ethiopia and Ukraine.

We know very little about the real St. George. He was an officer in the Roman army who refused to recant his faith when Imperial orders were issued that no Christian should serve in the army because their loyalty was suspect, for putting God before the emperor. He was tortured and executed and his courage in the face of death served as an inspiration for many.

We might be forgiven for thinking that we now live in very different times and this brave man has nothing to say to us in 2024. Unfortunately, Christianity is the most persecuted faith in the world. The World Watch List reports that 365 million Christians face persecution and discrimination for their faith. That is 1 in 7 of the global Christian population. Last year, 4998 Christians were murdered and 14 766 churches and Christian properties were attacked. The new Bishop of Winchester has been instrumental in raising the fact of Christian persecution in the House of Lords and lobbying Government departments to consider religious persecution of Christians alongside other human rights abuses perpetuated by regimes.

It is shocking that the media stays silent on this subject. That ordinary people trying to live their lives and worship

in the way they wish, are subject to physical assault, rape, and even death. That Christians are prevented from owning businesses, and restricted to only the most menial jobs. That communities are provided with electricity and communications while Christian villages are deliberately left off the grid.

St. George perhaps is an apt patron saint after all. The long-standing British preferences for the underdog and playing fair by the rules might be just the qualities that we need to exhibit to speak out in protection of the right to worship freely. Freedom of speech and equality under law are principles that we should seek to promote. But we should also remember that Jesus said that persecution would be a reality to those who seek to follow him. At the end of the Beatitudes, the list of those who are blessed, Jesus says:

"I say love your enemies. Pray for those who persecute you. In that way you will be acting as true children of your Father in heaven. For he gives sunlight to both the evil, and the good, and he sends rain on the just and the unjust, too. If you only love those who love you, what good is that? Even corrupt tax collectors do that much. If you are only kind to your friends, how are you different from everyone else? Even pagans do that. But you are to be perfect, even as your Father in heaven is perfect." Matt 5:43-47

May you never know persecution. But may we also pray for those who do.







## Binsted Parish Council is revolting!

As many of you know, Binsted **Parish Council submitted a strong** objection to East Hampshire District **Council's Local Plan Consultation** (Reg 18) in March. Put simply, we thought EHDC's Draft Plan proposed too many houses, in the wrong place, with no infrastructure, along with environmental destruction. If approved, EHDC's Plan would more than double Binsted parish's current 1,900 population and would cover 111 hectares of greenfield land -4% of our entire parish. Moreover, EHDC's Plan only covers the land in EHDC's part of Binsted parish. SDNP's Local Plan is yet to follow, and its plans will be additional to EHDC's. Frankly, it's been gruelling to get up to speed on the aspects of planning policy we needed to consider, as none of the parish council team has a professional background in planning.

But our experience has generated an important positive. It's been a real pleasure to meet some amazing parishioners, from both the Neatham Down and Holt Pound areas, who have inspired spirited local responses to the EHDC proposals in a very short space of time. As this article goes to press, the highest responses of all the Local Plan sites proposed are to 'our' development sites. With 4 days still to go before the end of the consultation:

- 1,043 people have commented on the Neatham Down 'Strategic Site' (Site ALT-8); and
- 74 people have so far commented on Holt Pound (Site HOP-1).

A further positive is that the Neatham Down campaign (www. saveneathamdown.org) has worked very constructively with other local Alton campaign groups, coming together to fight the overdevelopment of Alton, instead of fighting like a bag of ferrets to find a sacrificial site. Of all those drawn into the campaigning, 11-year old Erin Hills from Neatham Down is amongst the most inspirational. Her poem, opposite, speaks to us all.

#### We think it's time for Binsted parish to get 'on the front foot'

The past few years have brought a seemingly endless series of difficult major planning applications, which have been sapping for all on their frontline. From Grundon's proposal for a dioxin dump, Northbrook, Veolia's AERF and subsequent anaerobic digester, IGas' aggregate distribution compound... as well as our ongoing quest for safer roads, traffic calming and efforts to stop Farnborough Airport's expansion. Residents are reaching 'objection exhaustion'.

Mounting a defence against each new, unwelcome proposal takes energy and puts us on the 'back foot', feeling perpetually at risk of being outmanoeuvred by opponents. There's also another, more insidious cost. The 'opportunity cost' of constantly fighting these proposals is that we're so busy saying what we don't want, that we fail to articulate what we do want.

It's now time to speak up about what we DO want. Last summer's consultation, when parishioners gave their views for Binsted's Parish Priority Statement, identified clear priorities. We now need to convert those aspirations into action. The parish council has already expanded its Transport Working Group to involve non-councillors to address traffic problems (road traffic volumes, speeds and safety, and the need for safe cycle routes). We now need to similarly expand our Local Plan Working Group, so we can make progress on identifying potential brownfield locations (such as farmyards) as alternatives to building on farmland and areas of high biodiversity, and on finding ways of providing genuinely affordable housing to help local families to stay in this beautiful area.

## Katharine Swailes and Caron Penney: The Language of Weaving

Katharine Swailes and Caron Penney are artists, tapestry weavers, and educators. Alongside their drawings and paintings, they create wall-based artworks using the ancient technique of handwoven tapestry. Swailes and Penney met at the West Dean Tapestry Studio, where they were professional master weavers for nearly twenty years. Today, they work alongside each other in their studio in the Arun Valley, West Sussex.

As a couple and working partners, they share a passion for the traditional practice of tapestry weaving and its development and recognition as an art form. This locates them within a historical network of women artists and designers whose work in the field of textiles is slowly being recognised for its artistic contribution to the development of contemporary art and design in this country.

#### **Katharine Swailes**

Katharine Swailes (b.1963) is one of today's leading contemporary artists working with tapestry weaving. Born and brought up in the beautiful Upper Eden Valley in Cumbria, now based in rural Sussex, the qualities of light and colour that shift across the landscape continue to inspire her. Swailes has exhibited widely and has work in numerous private and public collections, including the Guy's & St. Thomas' Art Collection who purchased the work for the maternity ward in 2019 at London Art Fair.

#### **Caron Penney**

Caron Penney (b.1970) is one of today's leading contemporary artists working with tapestry weaving. Born in Hampshire and brought up in the picturesque market village of Botley. Penney weaves with traditional materials synonymous with hand-woven tapestry, from worsted wool to gilt gold thread. She studied Constructed Textiles at Middlesex University and alongside her own practice, she teaches tapestry weaving. Penney has exhibited widely and has work in numerous private and public collections, including the Rumi Foundation, who purchased the tapestry 'The Red Line' at Collect Art Fair in 2022, in support of artists who create work of important social significance and social understanding. The exhibition contains 15 woven

tapestries alongside drawings, sketchbooks and materials. In this exhibition, Swailes presents two series of works, Glyphs and Loops and Colourfield tapestries and Penney presents her abstract grid and text-based work.

# WAYMARKS...

## Maintaining Binsted's Rights of Way

After the wettest February on record, most of our footpaths and bridleways are affected by muddy, slippery conditions - some are even flooded and impassable. Even with the onset of meteorological spring and its warmer temperatures, these conditions will persist for a while. When venturing out on the Rights of Way network, do make sure that you are wearing appropriate footwear with a good grip - my wellies have seen more action this winter than they have for a long time! Take particular care on routes with steep gradients and flights of steps which can be very slippery at this time of year.

Like many, when I am out walking with my dogs, I like to stride out at a pace that gets the heart pumping. However, at this time of year, with the arrival of many songbirds, I find myself taking a ten or fifteen minute break where I sit or stand quite still and just listen to what is going on around me in the trees and hedgerows. At first, this confused the dogs, who looked at me inquiringly, but now they seem to have accepted this as the new way and take the opportunity to explore for a while, coming back to check whether I have snapped out of it. I have never been able to easily identify birds by their distinctive songs, so I decided to get some tuition. I only have a few apps on my smartphone that I ever use when out walking - mainly OSMaps for occasional

navigation and Strava to measure distances. I have now added a rather excellent one called Merlin Bird ID by Cornell Labs. Using this app, you can have your phone listen out for birdsong and identify any birds that it has on its database, complete with a picture. It highlights the bird that is singing at the moment. You can save these recordings and replay them later if you wish. On one recent ten minute session I (and my phone) heard Blackbird, Robin, Redwing, Songthrush, Dunnock, Chaffinch, Great Tit, Blue Tit, Long-tailed Tit, Mallard, Wren, Goldcrest, Firecrest and a Jay! I can highly recommend the app, and I am now able to identify many birds without my phone's assistance. Things can only get better, as Spring progresses.

The Rail to Trail Walking Festival starts imminently and runs from 6-14 April. All walks start and end at a SWR railway station and there are a range of over twenty, for walkers of all abilities. The walks all have expert leaders who are a mine of information about their local areas. Locally, walks include Bentley, Binsted and the Alice Holt Forest. Slightly further away, you can explore Frensham and Bourne as well as the Devil's Punchbowl. At the extremities of the county, there are walks in the New Forest and on the Isle of Wight, for the more adventurous. You can browse the various walks and book a place at https:/ hillstoharbourcrp.co.uk/rail-to-trail/

The Binsted volunteers are regularly inspecting the parish's paths, but if you would like to report a problem on any of the Binsted Rights of Way, whether it is a fallen tree, a broken stile, a collapsed fingerpost or simply some overgrown vegetation, you can do so online on the Hampshire "Report a problem on a right of way" page - this requires you to create an account and log in to the site first. Alternatively, you can use the volunteer team's own email address to do so - it is BinstedRoW@gmail.com. One final way of reporting a Rights of Way problem is to do so on the Binsted Community Facebook group. The volunteer team will try to identify problems reported there and deal with them promptly if we can in all cases, please give as much location information as possible.

## Have you seen this insect? Asian hornet, *Vespa velutina*

## What is it?

A highly aggressive predator of native insects that poses a significant threat to honey bees and other pollinators. Originally from Asia, in 2004 this invasive non-native species was accidentally introduced to France where it has spread rapidly and into neighbouring countries. Since 2016 a number of sightings have been recorded in the UK.



## News from the Bentley Bell Tower – or ringing the changes

As reported in February's magazine, the bells at Bentley remain silent but there has been progress behind the scenes on identifying the work that needs to be done to allow them to be rung again.

The immediate issue is that various fittings which allow the bells to be rung are simply worn out and this has resulted in a couple of injuries to our bell ringers. Hence the decision to take the bells out of action until these fittings can be replaced: The last refurbishment was made in 1912, so the bells and fittings have served the parish well!

Beyond a short-term repair which will allow St Mary's bells to ring out again, we are planning a much bigger project to fully renovate the running gear and augment the current ring of six to eight, by adding a new treble and second. This will complete the work that was intended in 1912, when Gillett & Johnson installed a bell frame for eight bells. During that work, four of the original Samuel Knight bells from 1703 were recast – the five and the tenor are still the original Samuel Knight bells. Interestingly, the recast bells are numbered 3 to 6 and it seems likely that the plan to add Bells 1 and 2 was shelved at the start of the Great War.

This work will also include an essential upgrade to the electrics, which are estimated to have been installed some 60 years ago. We are also planning to clean, re-tune, and re-hang the bells and to refurbish the bell frame. We have arranged for four firms of bell engineers to visit to provide quotes for the work and are waiting to receive these,



but as a ballpark based on other local tower refurbishment projects, we are likely to be looking at some £60-70,000 before VAT.

We are very grateful to Jack Regin, Captain of the Binsted Bell Tower and the District Maintenance Officer for the Alton and Petersfield District within the Winchester and Portsmouth Diocesan Guild of Church Bell Ringers, for his advice and for co-ordinating the bell engineer visits.

Several other interesting facts have come to light from these visits. Whilst we were aware that the bells were restored in 1912, other fittings are earlier, so it is little wonder that they now require replacement. The bells have also been identified as of a design by Canon Henry T. Ellacombe, who was notable in the late 19th century for improvements in belfry design. There is mention of the Bentley bells in The Bell News and Ringers Record of 7 June 1890:

#### **"BENTLEY HAMPSHIRE**

The six bells of this church, tenor 14 cwt., have all been rehung with complete new fittings, and they have also been quarterturned. The work has been satisfactorily carried out by Mr Harry Stokes, Church Bell Hanger of Woodbury, near Exeter. They were re-opened after being silent for several years on May 14th, by six clergymen, members of the Winchester Diocesan Guild, who were all highly pleased with the "go" of them." Our current plan is to tackle the required work in two phases. The first phase would see essential repairs to the fittings and work on the electrics to enable the bells to be rung on a limited basis for events such as weddings, major festivals and commemorative events. We have been generously allocated a grant of £1,000 from the Bentley Fete and Flower Show Committee towards this work and a further £1,000 has been received from East Hampshire District Council via their Local Councillor Grant scheme (in which respect we are most grateful to Councillor David Ashcroft for his support). But we still need to find the remainder of the estimated £3,500 - £4,000 cost for this phase. Our hope is to complete this work before the end of May in time for those couples marrying at St Mary's who have requested bells.

The second phase of work would comprise the full restoration of the belfry and will necessitate a significant fund-raising effort. We will provide a further update once all the bell engineer quotes have been received.
