n 7th June we had our first meeting of "Matt's Chats" over breakfast in the Binsted Inn. We had nearly 20 people there and very generously, the Pub didn't charge us! We looked at the question, What does a good life look like? I began with a quote from Socrates who focused on this question throughout his life. Socrates said "The unexamined life is not worth living." According to him, we need to lift the lid and see what is going on. Life is not something that happens to us, but something that we shape by the thousands of choices we make every day. How do we know what to focus on? What is genuinely going to do us good? If you are interested, the next gathering will be in October, so keep your eyes open for more details.

Socrates taught for 40 years and his student, Plato, taught for 50 years and finally his student, Aristotle taught for 40 years, including being the tutor to Alexander the Great. These three are acknowledged as the greatest philosophers in ancient history and echoes of their work are still with us. 130 years of teaching, debating and writing is a remarkable legacy. But compare them with Jesus and things take on a very real significance. Instead of decades of teaching, Jesus taught for 3 years, but the Sermon of the Mount is acknowledged as the most profound ethical statement of how humans should live ever made.

Jesus painted no pictures, yet the finest paintings of Raphael, Michelangelo and Leonardo da Vinci are all inspired by his life. Jesus wrote no poetry, but the writings of Dante, Milton, Eliot and Auden among others were shaped by him. Jesus didn't compose any music but Haydn, Handel, Beethoven and Bach reached their highest talents in hymns, symphonies and oratorios composed in his honour. Jesus is quite simply the greatest teacher who has ever lived.

In 1926, the Rev James Allan Francis wrote a piece called "One Solitary Life". I won't quote it in full but it can be easily found on the internet. In it Francis writes about Jesus, "He never had a family, or owned a home. He never set foot inside a big city. He never travelled two hundred miles from the place he was born. He never wrote a book or held office. He did none of the things that usually accompany greatness..."

"All the armies that ever marched. All the navies that ever sailed And all the parliaments that ever sat And all the kings that ever reigned Put together Have not affected the life of man Upon this earth As powerfully as this One Solitary Life."

May God bless you all and I look forward to hearing your thoughts



Binsted Parish Council -Update

After four years as Chair of Binsted Parish Council, Alison Melvin has decided to stand down in the role. Everyone at the Parish Council and I'm sure many parishioners would like to thank her for her hard work and dedication over this period. Alison has given huge amounts of her spare time and energy into enhancing the life and environment of the parish, and her dogged determination to sort out problems and pursue many and various organisations and people to get things done (or indeed stop unwelcome things from happening!) is an inspiration.

I'm pleased to say though that Alison will be staying on as a Parish Councillor, and one of our other councillors Dominic Hearne has agreed to take on the role of Chair- contact details for all of the councillors can be found at https://

One of the things that Alison has been instrumental in driving forward is Blacknest Fields, so it felt like a good opportunity to highlight what's going on there.

July and August are the best months of the year to enjoy the stunning sights of the butterfly meadows at Blacknest Fields, the site for nature recovery managed by Binsted Parish Council and located in Blacknest. The weather this spring has been much kinder to the butterflies and bees than last year,





so the volunteers who help manage the site are hopeful that July and August will allow us all to enjoy a brilliant display of summer residents. From the stunning and powerful Silver-washed fritillary to the elusive Purple Hairstreak butterflies high up in the oak trees, it is certainly worth a walk to Blacknest Fields on a sunny summer day to see what you can spot.

The site is adjacent to Alice Holt Forest in Blacknest, 300 metres north of the Jolly Farmer crossroads. It is best reached by Bridleway 41, as there is no public car parking on site. A handy map detailing a four mile circular walk from Gravel Hill carpark (or Bentley Station) to Blacknest Fields can be downloaded from the Parish Council website:

Picnicking at Blacknest Fields is welcome, but BBQs and fires are prohibited. Dogs on leads are welcome in the front 'Oak Tree Meadow' enclosed area, but not elsewhere on site, where sensitive wildlife needs protecting. News from Bentley Parish Council

Firstly, I'd like to thank all those who attended the Annual Parish Assembly at the Memorial Hall in April. It was a very informative and enjoyable evening, particularly hearing all the reports from the clubs and groups in Bentley. We are fortunate to have so many who dedicate their time to organising events and activities for the benefit of the whole community.

After a fine spring, although perhaps a little too dry for the gardeners, summer is with us. In speaking about the dry spring, I should mention it has been both a blessing and a curse for the Recreation Ground renovations. During the winter we were hoping for a dry March and early April so that the contractors could get on with the ground works. The dry weather that followed was perfect for scarifying, levelling and reseeding, and also laying a new cricket square; so far so good. Unfortunately, at the point where we needed a little precipitation the rains failed to appear. Although, as I write at the beginning of June, the outfield is starting to turn green the square is well, rather bare. However, we are hopeful that, with the rain forecast in early June, by the time you read this article the outfield will be fully recovered and ready for this year's fete and flower show.

Back in February you will remember we reported that Footpath 13, which runs from Rectory Lane to the Station, was blocked after a sink hole appeared in the section below the sewage works. The cause was discovered to be a collapsed pipe carrying clean water from the works to the river. Thames Water have now repaired this pipe and reinstated the footpath. However, walkers will notice that alongside much of the footpath there is also a temporary pipe. This is replacing another damaged pipe which carries sewage from the Station Road side of the river up to the works for treatment. We understand that surveying is underway and a permanent replacement pipe will be installed (underground) later in the year.

One further note on Footpath 13. We were contacted a couple of years ago by Hants County Council regarding plans to give the footpath an all-weather surface to make it a more usable in wetter weather. We received a message recently from HCC that delivery is planned for later this year.

Turning now to a serious matter concerning Carters' Meadow. Bentley Wildlife has brought to our attention an infestation of Mare's Tail, or Horsetail, in the field, near the pond. Some of you will know, from experience, how invasive this weed is. It can spread rapidly through underground runners and needs to be controlled with rigorous management. Apart from the potential damage to the ecology of Carters' Meadow, we are also concerned that spores from the plant can be spread by dogs and walkers to other parts of the village, so we would ask residents to avoid the field for the time being. We will be working closely with Bentley Wildlife, who have contacted other groups with experience managing such infestations. We'll keep you posted on progress.

We are still in need of a School Liaison Officer: As mentioned previously, the objective of the role is to keep a line of communication between the school and the parish council such that both parties can effectively support one another, so if there is a parent who would like to take on the role, please get in touch with our Clerk, Emma Wadey, 07795 326539, clerk@bentleyparishcouncil.gov.uk

Finally, after passing external examination our Neighbourhood Plan has now been forwarded for review by EHDC prior to its formal adoption. We expect this to take place in July. This has become a critical document for planning in the parish since its counterpart in the Development Plan for Bentley, the district council's Local Plan, is still no closer to completion as EHDC wait for the government to clarify its nation planning strategy. This has been further complicated by the local council reorganisation in Hampshire.

Let me begin with oak apples, if for no other reason than that the very name for galls comes from the Latin galla, which translates as 'oak apple'. I was recently invited to see two magnificent Oaks in a field near here. The owner loves his trees and these two have played an important part in the upbringing of his children. As we moved around them he spotted what looked exactly like an apple, but was no bigger than a lychee. The more we looked, the more we found. They are not the fruit of Oaks; we all know that's acorns. They have been induced to grow, starting at a leaf bud, by a wasp larva, emerging from its egg and munching on the bud. The larva's saliva triggers a response from the tree which is a kind of cell metaplasia, which is the transformation of a cell type to another cell type. The result is a growth

of Oak cells that looks like it has grown 'naturally'. The larva lives and grows inside the oak apple, feeding on the nutrients it has provoked the tree to provide. Incidentally, they don't taste anything like apples.

Also recently, I was doing my stint on the stall of the Alton Natural History Society when a chap came up with a sprig he had cut from a Hazel. On the underside of the leaves was a rash of small, hard growths that were bright red in colour. These were galls that had been caused by a leaf mite.

I cast my mind back to when I first became interested in tree welfare, and had found a Wych Elm growing in a most unfortunate position, tucked up against the wall of an old cottage. There were a number of reasons for worrying about the welfare of this tree, but, among these, was the number of leaf galls I could feel, rather than see, on the underside of the leaves. This set me off on a search for the cause of the galls, that led me to the Woodland Trust and the Forest Research Tree Alert resource that have since become a central part of my journey with trees.

But, actually, I don't have to leave my own garden to find interesting galls. I have a couple of failed standard roses where the graft has failed and left only the wild stock. On these I find Robin's pincushion, which is a spherical, red, fibrous growth on the stems of Dogroses. You are more likely to see the galls than the adult gall wasps or the grubs.

This is a huge subject of study. There are thousands of galls growing on all kinds of plants, and caused by all sorts of organisms. Galls can occur on the stems, leaves, flowers, fruits, seeds and roots of plants, and a wide variety of plants are affected, including many very common species. Oaks and Willows are particularly rich in galls. Whether you are inspired to a career as a cecidologist, or are just curious to identify what strange alien is growing on your tree, you would do well to start at the website of the British Plant Gall Society.

Ancient Woodland: A celebration of place (19th July - 20 September)

Local artists Mary Waltham and Jackie Amies respond to the surrounding ancient woodlands of East Hampshire.

Ancient woodlands are the richest land habitat in the UK and home to many threatened species. These distinctive and often small tracts of woodland have been largely untouched by humans since before 1600 and cover just 2.5% of the UK.

Undisturbed soils and decaying wood create conditions that encourage species diversity of plants, invertebrates, fungi, birds and mammals. Ancient woods are also a living record of centuries of interaction and interdependence between man and woodland, they often contain remnants of archaeological features such as wood banks, pits and charcoal kilns. No surprise then that these woods are also home to rich and diverse myths and folklore.

Binsted Church Needs Your Help

The Church of the Holy Cross is a beautiful mainly Norman church with 13th-15th Century additions. It is a Grade-1 Listed building and a fine example of this country's architectural history with many unique features and an especially fine interior.

Members of the congregation continue to look for ways to manage repairs effectively, reduce costs and boost income by holding fund-raising events. Nevertheless, this is not proving to be enough.

A group of us, who are all local residents but are not regular churchgoers, have become concerned and realise the maintenance costs cannot continue to be met primarily by the congregation. We know we are fortunate to have such a significant and historic church in our village. We also like to hear the church bells or simply show it to our visitors, including the grave of Field Marshal Viscount Montgomery.

We therefore believe we should help in the upkeep of the church and have established The Friends of Binsted Church. Our purpose is to help towards the maintenance costs only of the building and not anything connected to the church services or its administrative costs.

We do hope you feel the same way because we would like you to become a Friend of Binsted Church and sponsor, for one day (or days) a year, the upkeep of the building and the churchyard. This currently amounts to £35 per day.

A Bentley Wildlife Group series... What are Habitats and why they can't stand alone.

Wildlife survives thanks to its habitats. It seems worth looking a bit more at what we mean by habitat.

The term actually has several meanings: in ecology it can refer to the habitat of a species which describes the area and resources of a particular species or, and this is what we will look at, a community of plants and animals together with their physical (abiotic) environment. In our parishes we have various habitats: forest, woodlands, hedgerows, grasslands, lakes, ponds and a river. Some habitats can be at a landscape scale or be a microhabitat like a puddle. Taken individually or together habitats can be considered as ecosystems. Ecosystems are dynamic complexes of plant, animal and micro-organism communities and their non-living environment, which interact as a whole. These definitions I have drawn from EUNIS and they underly the EU Habitats Directive which the UK has retained post Brexit.

Grasslands are a particularly vulnerable habitat. In Bentley these would have been of the more neutral type (ph value 5.5 - 6.5) on old clayey pastures. While these grasslands are not as flower rich compared to grasslands on chalky soils, the number and density of their flowering herbs creates a rich resource for invertebrates. This strong basis to the food web supports foraging birds, mammals and amphibians. The 2018 survey of Carters Meadow East identified the meadow as semi-improved grassland with 20 species of sedges, rushes and herbs. At some stage the removal of grazers, especially cattle, damaged the habitat as they would have maintained a variable sward height essential for a flourishing habitat community. Any use of fertiliser would have altered the grassland by increasing the dominance of grasses and sward height further

reducing its value as a habitat. Nevertheless this modified grassland can be restored to a neutral state by various methods: see the How to Rewild website.

However, apart from the quality of these habitats, the important thing from the point of view of wildlife is their connectivity: they need to be like stepping stones. One may think of invertebrates as firmly terrestrial but in fact bugs move around just as much as birds and animals. As our climate changes there will be more moving around and connecting up isolated habitat hotspots will be increasingly important. As it turns out Bentley is at the intersection of two insect flight ways which Buglife have identified as part of a countrywide system they've named "B-Lines". It appears that not only bees but also the other 4,000 species of pollinators use these flight ways.

I hope notice about the public consultation on the Local Nature Recovery Strategy for Hampshire reached all households in Bentley: the closing date for comments was 23rd June. It set out proposals to reverse nature's decline across the county. My comment suggested that parish councils might have their own Local Biodiversity Action Plans encouraging stakeholders within and between parishes to collaborate in connecting up habitats through their own Local Nature Recovery Network?




