love the old TV show Father Ted. It's observation of the stresses and strains placed on a bumbling and inept priest are hilarious and many within the church can see themselves in the characters and situations. At one point Father Ted says, "That's the great thing about Catholicism - it's very vague and no one knows what it's all really about!" Change the word Catholicism for Christianity and you get a very common response to church and faith today. Many people have a deep question regarding the church, what is it all about?

Many have fond childhood memories about church, singing hymns at school, remembering some of the Bible stories, like Noah's Ark or Daniel in the lion's den. But what is it all about? Looking at the Church of England, there are churches in every village and town and every square inch of the country is covered by parishes. Everyone, whether you believe or not, is entitled to call on the local church for weddings and funerals, or other life events. Churches are places of beauty and oases of quiet in a rushing world which many enjoy visiting. What is it all about?

Wherever you go around the world, if you see a Starbucks or a McDonalds, they will look the same and have similar layouts and menus. If you go into a church, there may be some things in common, but each church is individual and you may have a service with an organ, or guitars, with robes, or casual clothing. There will be prayers and music and a sermon, but it will feel different from place to place. Churches are not uniform but have some things in common. What is it all about?

Is Father Ted right? That the church is very vague and no one knows what it's all really about?

Christianity is ultimately not about a faith, a system of belief or it's buildings and art. It is about a person. Jurgen Moltmann became a Christian while he was a prisoner of war in the Second World War in Scotland. He was impressed with the love he received from the local people who gave him a German Bible to read. He became an influential theologian and thought deeply about evil and suffering. He concluded,

"Where Jesus is, there is life. The sick are healed, saddened life is given fresh heart, marginalised life is accepted, captive life is freed. The movements of Jesus are nothing other than movements of healing, of liberation, of righteousness and justice. Jesus didn't bring a new religion into the world. What he brought was new life."

Our society, culture and nation need new life. We need hope and something worth living for. We need a purpose and direction. When you lose something, you don't just carry on. You retrace your footsteps until you find what you lost. It is time for all of us to stop and go back and rediscover God's rescue plan for humanity. Father Ted was wrong. Christianity isn't vague. Faith in Jesus, and the life he offers, is true. He alone can give us a fresh start. I invite you to reconsider Jesus and his truth for yourself. May God heal our hearts and our land.



Binsted Parish CouncilAn update

In April's edition of the parish magazine I mentioned the grants available from the Parish Council for local organisations and projects that contribute to the life of our community and people living in the parish.

I'm pleased to say that this year we received more applications than in previous years, and from a wide range of organisations seeking funding for a diverse range of activities. Whilst the funding pot available in any year is never big enough to fund every project in full, we were able to provide grants to all of the groups who applied, including the work of Citizens Advice East Hampshire; projects run by the two Home-Start charities in our area and Bushy Leaze Children and Family Centre that support local families; equipment for Rowledge and Binsted Primary School; maintaining the grounds at Holy Cross Church; new facilities for pickleball at the tennis club; and youth activities run by Hive Helpers, a local organisation that works to improve the mental and physical wellbeing of adults and children in the local community through beekeeping and nature conservation.

As well as these grants, the Parish Council also has access to other funds such as the Neighbourhood Community Infrasturcture Levy from the District Council and South Downs National Park that can be spent on projects to improve local infrastructure, facilities and services. And we are also able to provide help, advice and useful contact points for other grants and support available from the likes of East Hants District Council and Hampshire County Council.

We are also keen to support local organisations, clubs, charities, and businesses in other ways- whether that be using the facilities at the Binsted Recreation Ground and Pavilion, or promoting your organisation, events, and fundraising activities via our Facebook site (https://www.facebook.com/BinstedParish/), website, or parish noticeboards. Regenerative Farming talk, Friday 24th October 2025, Froyle Village Hall.

Simon Porter will be explaining how Regenerative farming has the potential for the first time to produce the needed quantities of high-quality food to feed the world, whilst reducing inorganic sprays and fertilisers. I'm prompted to write about them as I have followed the progress of a group of Alder Buckthorn in Alice Holt through this year. They are said to be fussier than their cousin about where they thrive, and these all sit beside a path and close to a drainage ditch, enjoying the open air and the damp. Just like their namesakes the Alder tree *Alnus cordata*.

More of the chemistry later, but first, let me talk about the beauty of our two native species. They both bear delicate white flowers in May. These develop into berries no bigger than elderberries, and progress in colour from green, through yellow to red to deep purple, as the months pass. Come September the ripe fruit is starting to be sacrificed to the grateful birds. But don't be tempted to follow their example, at least not until you have read to the end of this.

The leaves are similar in shape, and the brimstone caterpillar makes no distinction, feasting on both.

The outer bark is dark brown, but the inner bark is bright yellow when exposed. A yellow dye is obtained from the leaves and bark. It is used in Russia and turns black when mixed with salts of iron. A green dye is obtained from the unripe fruit, and a blue or grey dye from the ripe berries.

But the trees are best known for their pharmaceutical benefits. The dried bark and the fruit was once used as a laxative due to its 3-7% anthraguinone content which stimulates the colon. Beware: the effects are explosive! The cousin that is easiest to distinguish by its thorns is called Purging Buckthorn Rhamnus cathartica. Cathartic by name, cathartic by nature! Cousin Alder Buckthorn Frangula alna is hardly less dangerous. John Gerard wrote in his Herball, in 1597, that the medicine should only be administered 'to young, strong and lustie people of the Countrie. which do set more store of their money than their lyves'.

My favourite story concerning this aspect is that of the Benedictine monks of St Albans Abbey, who consumed Purging Buckthorn berries on a routine basis; whether this was for health reasons or religious penance remains unclear. The evidence for this emerged in the 1920's, when the abbey's ancient latrine pits were excavated and great numbers of buckthorn seeds were found. What more quintessential devotion could there be to evidence-based research, than that of the hero(ine) who did the counting.

And the fireworks don't end there. Alder buckthorn charcoal is prized in the manufacture of gunpowder and is regarded as the best wood for the purpose. It is particularly valued for time fuses because it has a very even burn rate. If only I had known this when, as a lad, I was conducting my own experiments with gunpowder, I could have done some real damage! The light, flammable charcoal was still much in demand for fuses during the Second World War, when the Women's Timber Corps was charged with locating natural stands of Alder Buckthorn in the countryside. The quantities to be found to this day in the New Forest were achieved through supplemental planting by the WTC.



Licensed Lay Minister

If you have read the Meet the Team article about me, you'll have learnt that on 11th October I will become a Licensed Lay Minister at a service in Winchester Cathedral.

The Church of England website describes the role of Licensed Lay Minister (LLM), which is also known as a Reader, as a leadership role in the church serving alongside clergy to support people in faith and enable mission.

After a 37-year career working in IT, I retired early from full-time paid work after being treated for prostate cancer. I sensed God calling me to do something else, something better, with the rest of my life. So, I became Operations Manager for the Benefice in 2017 and I thought helping Yann and then Matt run the Benefice was what God was asking me to do.

But constant prodding from God, plus prompts from many other people, encouraged me to attend a Vocations Day run by the Diocese. When I heard them describing the role of a Licensed Lay Minister I felt immediately this was what I was being called to do.

It takes a while to become an LLM. First there is a short period of discernment and a selection panel involving one of the Bishops from the Diocese. Once you been accepted, there follows two years of training.

I have had the joy of being part of a small cohort being trained by the Mission and Ministry Team at Winchester Diocese. During term time, I have had weekly training. It's either on Zoom on a Thursday evening or in-person at Old Alresford Place on a Saturday. Those leading the training, Amy, Helen and Will, have been amazing and they have taught me so much. The training has covered a broad range of subjects from the Bible, through preaching skills, theological study, leadership, pastoral care and mission.

Much of the training has focussed on our personal formation, building on the formal education we've had with practical experience and helping us in our spiritual and character development. I've enjoyed it so much that I've even signed up for an optional further third year of training, which I started in September.

It has been quite a journey for me. I have learnt lots of new things, I've discovered so much about myself and built lifelong friendships with those I have been training with.

I now look forward to helping others on their journeys of faith, enabling the mission of the church in the everyday activities and leading, both in church and beyond.

And in case you are wondering, I have robes I will wear on occasion. So you may see me in them in church. I'll be wearing a blue scarf over my cassock and surplice. Please do come and say hello.

Holy Cross Day


Sunday September 14th 2025 HOLY CROSS CHURCH BINSTED

Halloween and All Souls' Day

Each year during October, for as long as I can remember, two traditions have emerged side by side generating much discussion and sometimes very strong opinions! They are, of course, Halloween on 31st October, and All Souls' Day. celebrated on 2nd November, and the debate usually centres around whether the two could ever be compatible, so maybe a helpful starting point would be to know the origins and something about each of the festivals.

Halloween started over 2 000 years ago with the Celtic festival of Samhain, which marked the end of summer, the gathering in of the harvest and the beginning of winter. The Celts believed that on 31st October. the veil between the world of the living and the spirit world was at its thinnest, and that on this night the spirits of those who had died could cross, or come back, into the world of the living. And so early Halloween traditions included the lighting of bonfires to penetrate and ward off the darkness, the wearing of costumes, often animal heads, to protect themselves from wandering ghosts, among other things. Today Halloween is often seen simply as a time to dress up, go trick or treating, carve pumpkins and decorate homes, but still, under the costumes and decorations lies something deeper - our natural fascination as humans with life, with death, and with what happens after death. And so even if Halloween has become perhaps in some ways more 'light' hearted' if one could call it that over the ages, it's important that we not lose sight of its origins, and the fact that it focuses on the dark side of death, using skeletons, ghosts, tombstones and the afterworld in a way that makes a mockery of death, portraying it as something scary.

And that's where the contrast with All Souls' Day comes in. Originating in the 10th century in a French monastery, All Souls' Day also invites us to think about life, and death, and what lies beyond, but in an entirely different way. All Souls' Day isn't about fear, horror, ghosts and darkness; it's about love, connection and the hope that we have in Christ Jesus. It's a day that is set aside to think, with gratitude and thankfulness, of those who have died, and to remember that life doesn't end with death. For Christians. it's a reminder that there is a bigger story out there, and that physical, or earthly, death is not the end, but that God's love and our eternal life extends way beyond death. And for those for whom faith feels distant, there's still something deeply moving in taking time to remember and celebrate the people who influenced our lives as All Souls' Day invites us to slow down and reflect on the deeper mysteries of life.

And so are the two compatible? The short answer would be no, and to that end many churches and communities these days hold events on 31 October which offer an alternative to the sinister darkness of Halloween by focusing on positive themes rather than fear, with things like light displays and events that provide a safe and inclusive way to celebrate the season. And then All Souls' Day invites us to go deeper, providing us with an opportunity to honour the people we've loved, to reflect on what's truly important, and to open our hearts to the mystery of faith and eternal life in Christ Jesus.






